Writing in the Columbiad in 1898, Supreme Knight, Edward L. Hearn says a Knight should live according to the virtues of loyalty, charity, courtesy and modesty, “self denial and a careful respect for the feelings of others.”

Hearn’s administration modernizes the Order’s insurance program, employing mortality tables and other tools of commercial insurers.

The 1st exemplification of the Fourth Degree takes place on Feb. 22, 1900 in New York City; 1,100 Knights receive the degree. The following May, another 750 Knights take the degree in Boston.
